The Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development is responsible for the stewardship of provincial Crown land and natural resources, and for the protection of B.C.'s archaeological and heritage resources.

The West Coast Region is a vast area covering a large part of coastal British Columbia, including Vancouver Island, the Mainland Central Coast and Haida Gwaii. With 20,000 kilometres of coast line, many islands and inlets, the area has unique opportunities and challenges for natural resource management and business delivery.

The Licensed Section Head is accountable for the supervision of staff at the professional and specialist level. This position manages staff and financial resources, ensures achievement of and evaluates the outcomes of program goals and applies legislation, policies and professional standards. The Section Head leads projects and strategic initiatives to address large-scale and controversial issues within its geographic area.

- Degree in the natural resource field or equivalent as recognized by the relevant association, and three years working in natural resource management.
- Experience in negotiating and mediating solutions with stakeholders in natural resource management.
- Comprehensive experience in regulatory management in the natural resource field.
- Experience managing technical and/or professional staff in resource management.
- Experience supervising, leading, coaching and mentoring staff.
